

PRESS RELEASE

The final electoral rolls of Special Summary Revision of Electoral Rolls of intensive nature, 2019 have been published today (31.01.2019).

The Special Summary Revision of Electoral Rolls of intensive nature with reference to 01.01.2019 as the qualifying date commenced with draft publication on 01.09.2018. Claims and objections were received during the period from 01.09.2018 to 31.10.2018.

During the above revision period, 14,29,471 applications for inclusion of names were received and 13,96,326 applications were admitted and names included. 5,62,937 deletions have been made on account of shifting, death and duplicate entries.

2,21,351 applications were received for correction of entries and 2,19,392 were admitted. For transposition of entries within the Assembly Constituency, 1,26,920 applications were received and 1,22,301 have been admitted.

As per the final electoral rolls of Special Summary Revision of intensive nature, 2019, the total electorate in Tamil Nadu is 5.91 crores (Male – 2.92 crores ; Female – 2.98 crores and Third Gender – 5472).

Also, as per the final rolls, the Assembly Constituency with the highest number of electors is 27-Shozhinganallur Assembly Constituency in Kancheepuram district with 6,18,695 electors (Male: 3,11,102; Female: 3,07,518; Third Gender: 75). The Assembly Constituency which has the highest electors in the age group of 18-19 is 195.Thiruparankundram Assembly Constituency with 7,696 electors. (Male: 4,189; Female: 3,507; Third Gender: 0))

On the other hand, the lowest number of electors are in 18.Harbour Assembly Constituency in Chennai District with 1,66,515 electors (Male: 87,039; Female: 79,427; Third Gender: 49).

97 overseas electors have also been enrolled.

The electors who are PwDs (Persons with Disabilities) will be provided with necessary facilities during the elections.

The electoral rolls are available on CEO's website <http://elections.tn.gov.in>. Electors can check their names by visiting the same.

The period of Continuous Updation is in operation now. All eligible persons who have completed 18 years as on 01.01.2019 and who do not find their names in the Electoral Rolls can apply for inclusion at the respective offices of the Electoral Registration Officers or on **www.nvsp.in**. Public are requested to apply online through the above mentioned website.

As per the directions of the Election Commission of India, District Contact Centres have been established in all the districts of Tamil Nadu. The District Contact Centres have been provided with the toll free help line number 1950 uniformly across the State. For any election related queries, the public can call the District Contact Centre.
