Election Commission releases absolute number of votes polled in Phase 6

NEW DELHI

The Election Commission (EC) on Tuesday came out with the absolute number of votes polled in the sixth phase of the Lok Sabha election and the final turnout, which it pegged at 63.37%.

The absolute number of voters was released just three days after the voting for the sixth phase took place on May 25, while the numbers for the first five phases were released by the poll body 36 days after the first phase.

The highest turnout for the sixth phase was recorded in West Bengal at 82.71%, while the lowest of 55.4% was recorded in Jammu and Kashmir. However, the turnout for J&K was the highest in 30 years.

The total number of votes polled was

7,05,44,933 in 58 constituencies as against the total registered electors of 11,13,16,606, the EC said in a statement.

The EC had shared the absolute polling figures for the first time on May 25, a day after the Supreme Court refused to direct the poll body to disclose details of Form 17 C, which contains this data at the booth level and is handed out to all the polling agents of the candidates.

In an affidavit filed before the top court last week, the commission expressed concern that there was a "design, a pattern" that was at play in the petitioners' approach. In its statement on May 25, the EC reiterated this. "The commission notes the pattern of false narratives and mischievous design to vitiate electoral process", it said adding any alteration in the number of the votes polled was not possible.

EC orders suspension of Special Secretary to Odisha Chief Minister

The Election Commission has placed D.S. Kutey, Special Secretary to Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, under suspension, and directed Ashish Kumar Singh, Inspector-General of Police (CM Security) to undergo medical examination over charges of influencing the simultaneous Lok Sabha and Assembly elections in the State.

The two senior IPS officers were among a few key bureaucrats overseeing official operation of Odisha Chief Minister. The decision has been taken on basis of information forwarded by the Chief Electoral Officer of Odisha who indicated that the two officers were directly exerting "undue influence" on conduct of election work,

"This was further corroborated by various other inputs received from the field from time to time," the EC said in its order.

"Mr. Kutey should be placed under suspension under relevant service rules for unduly interfering in conduct of election. His headquarter is fixed at the Office of Resident Commissioner Odisha, New Delhi where he will report by 3 p.m. on May 29," the order says.

The shifting of Mr. Kutey is seen as significant step as the BJP had alleged that he was directly involved in election management for the Biju Janata Dal.

Mr. Singh, who has been on medical leave since May 4, should present himself for detailed medical exam, no later than May 30, the order said.

According to order, the Odisha CEO would ensure that the Director of AIIMS, Bhubaneshwar constituted a special medical board to ascertain the illness and treatment being undergone.

"Report on this shall reach the commission latest by May 31," it said.

Mizoram MP urges EC to let policemen away on poll duty vote

A Mizoram MP has written to the Election Commission (EC) seeking its intervention to allow 1,047 police personnel from the State to vote as they were away on election-related duties in other States. The polling for the lone Lok Sabha seat in the State was held on April 19.

K. Vanlalvena, Rajya Sabha member, said in a letter to the Chief Election Commissioner that currently 15 companies of the Mizoram Armed Police comprising 1,047 personnel were on election duty in Bihar, Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh. He said the State police nodal officer had requested the Chief Electoral Officer, Mizoram to make arrangements for voting, but they were informed that the request could not be processed for "technical reasons."

"Whatever the technical reasons may be, the fact of the matter is that 1,047 citizens of India have been denied their legitimate right to exercise their franchise. Such disenfranchisement of legitimate voters is totally unconstitutional. It is indeed unfortunate and ironic that this injustice has been served upon these Mizoram police personnel due to their deployment on election duty. Denial of voting opportunity to a voter simply on technical grounds is totally unacceptable," he said.

63.37% turnout recorded in Ph-6 of LS election: EC

The Election Commission on Tuesday put the voter turnout in the sixth phase of Lok Sabha elections at 63.37 per cent. Female voters in this phase too, like the fifth phase, were higher than men as 64.95 per cent women voted compared to 61.95 per cent men.

The total electorates in the 58 constituencies that went to poll last Saturday were 11,131,6606 out of which 70,544933 voted.

West Bengal had the highest polling percentage 82.71 per cent followed by Odisha (74.45 per cent), Jharkhand (65.39 per cent) and Haryana (64.80 per cent). Among the lowest polling states were Uttar Pradesh (54.04 per cent), Jammu and Kashmir (55.40 per cent), Bihar (57.18 per cent), and Delhi (58.69 per cent).

In Bihar highest polling Pashchim was in Champaran, in Haryana it was Sirsa, in Delhi it was North East, Odisha had Sambalpur, UP had Ambedkar Nagar and West Bengal had Bishnupur as . high polling areas.

EC transfers 3 WB cops ahead of Ph-7

"Suggestions for the replacements in these three posts were sought from the state secretariat by Wednesday," he said. Polling for final phase of the Lok Sabha elections is scheduled to be held in nine Lok Sabha seats of Dum Dum, Barasat, Basirhat, Jaynagar, Mathurapur, Diamond Harbour, Jadavpur, Kolkata Dakshin, Kolkata Uttar on June 1. - PTI

Women outpace men again in voter turnout in Phase 6

New Delhi: Women once again outshone men in terms of turnout in Phase 6, clocking nearly 65% voting as against 61% among their male counterpart. After Phase 5, which was the first round to see a higher polling percentage among women, Phase 6 is only the second of the six completed to witness better female participation.

EC on Tuesday released not only the overall and gender-wise turnout data for all states and parliamentary constituencies where polling was held in Phase 6 but also the absolute electors data and the absolute count of votes cast in the phase. While the absolute figures for Phase 6 have been shared by EC just three days after polling, it had put out the corresponding data for all the first five phases only on May 25, a day after Supreme Court had declined to direct the poll body to place Form 17C voter details in the public domain.

As per data for the six phases released by EC, 173 of the total 486 parliamen-

tary constituencies, where the votes lie sealed in EVMs, saw female voters beat their male counterparts in terms of polling percentage.

While Surat is excluded as it did not see any contest, the gender-wise poll percentage for Outer Manipur could not be worked out as voting there was split between Phase 1 and 2, with Phase 1 showing the turnout higher among female electors and Phase 2, among the male voters.

So far, Bihar has the highest share of its PCs with better women participation. Barring Aurangabad, Gaya and Nawada, women beat men in terms of turnout across the state's 32 constituencies where voting has concluded.

ECI suspends Odisha CM's spl secy for poll interference

IN a significant development, the Election Commission of India (ECI) on Tuesday ordered suspension of DS Kutey, special secretary to the chief minister's office (CMO), on charges of unduly interfering in the conduct of election.

The ECI fixed Kutey's head-

quarters at office of the resident commissioner in New Delhi. The 1997 batch IPS officer in the additional DG rank has been asked to report by 3pm on May 29, a letter by ECI secre-tary Rakesh Kumar to Odisha chief electoral officer said.

Similarly, the poll panel

asked IG (CM security) Ashish Singh to present himself for detailed medical examination by a special medical board constituted by the director of AIIMS,

Bhubaneswar not later than May 30.

Singh has been on medical leave since May 4. The CEO has been directed to coordinate to ensure that the director of AIIMS, Bhubaneswar constitutes the special medical

board to ascertain illness and treatment being undergone by Singh. The report on Singh by the CEO will have to reach the ECI by May 31. The ECI letter said action on

the two IPS officers was taken basing on a communication from the CEO on May 27 in which he had made certain averments indicating undue in-

fluence being exercised by the two officers directly connected with conduct of poll work.

The ECI said this was also corroborated by various other inputs received from the field from time to time.

The BJP had earlier alleged Kutey's involvement in poll process and sought that his cell phone be seized for verification of call detail records. A memorandum was submitted to the ECI in this regard.

EC: 3% more women voted than men in phase VI

THE Election Commission of India on Tuesday released the total voter turnout of 63.37% in the sixth phase of Lok Sabha polls in 58 seats in eight states and Union Territo-ries (UTs).

The states where the polling

The states where the polling took place on May 25 included Bihar (8), Haryana (10), Jammu & Kashmir (1), Jharkhand (4), NCT of Delhi (7), Odisha (6), Uttar Pradesh (14) and West Bengal (8). According to the data released by the poll panel, men voters' turnout was 61.95%, while 64.95 percent women voters cast their votes. The third gender turnout stood The third gender turnout stood

at 18.67%.

As per the statewide voter turnout, West Bengal reported

As per the statewide voter turnout, West Bengal reported the highest voter turnout of 82.71%. The voter turnout in 14 constituencies across Uttar Pradesh stood at 54.04%.

Delhi recorded a voter turnout of 58.69%, while Haryana recorded a 64.80% polling. Odisha and Jharkhand recorded a voter turnout of 74.45% and 65.39% respectively.

In the absolute numbers in the sixth phase out of 11,13,16,60 voters, 7,05,44,933 exercised their franchise, the ECI said in a statement.

Significantly, in the sixth phase more women voted than men: in Bihar 62,95% women voted against 51,95% men.
